

Spotlight Muir! Awards Celebration to Feature Shelton Johnson



Martha Lee, General Superintendent at the John Muir National Historic Site, has been promoted to the position of Deputy Regional Director for Public Use Management for the Pacific West Region. Martha will oversee a number of parks in such places as the Channel Islands, Mojave, Joshua Tree, Sequoia/Kings, Manzanar, Santa Monica Mountains, Lake Mead, Devils Postpile, and Cabrillo.

Anza Trail Exhibit Dedication

he National Park Service launched a new exhibit at the Martinez Adobe, part of the John Muir National Historic Site, on September 26. The Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail exhibit describes the 1775-76 trek of Spanish colonial expedition members through Arizona and California, ending at the San Francisco Bay Area—a distance of 1,200 miles.

Speakers at the dedication included Congressman George Miller, General Superintendent Martha Lee, Linda Yamane (Ohlone Native American), Martinez Mayor Rob Schroder, Chris Lehnertz (National Park Service, Pacific West Regional Director),

Lance Beeson (Anza Expedition Descendant), and Lauren Kardel (Amigos de Anza Drill Team). Naomi Torres, Superintendent of the Anza Trail, served as the Master of Ceremonies. Guests were treated to live music, lively dance and a multitude of family activities. The John Muir Association hosted a booth with refreshments.


