Δ Many habitats; fields, roadsides
- P3** *Symphyotrichum chilense*
California Aster
Δ Grasslands, salt marshes, disturbed places
- P4** *Brickellia californica*
California Brickelbush
Δ Diverse dry habitats
- P5** *Camissonia cheiranthifolia*
Beach Evening Primrose
Δ Sandy slopes, flats, coastal dunes
- P6** *Carex spissa*
San Diego Sedge
Δ Waterways
- P7** *Eriogonum grande* E. Greene var. *rubescens*
Red Flowered Buckwheat
Δ Dry cliffs
- P8** *Eriogonum umbellatum*
Sulphur Flower Buckwheat
Δ Dry, open, often rocky places
- P9** *Fragaria vesca* L.
Woodland Strawberry
Δ Partial shade in forests
- P10** *Heracleum lanatum*
Cow Parsnip
Δ Moist places, wooded or open
- P11** *Mimulus aurantiacus* new name *Diplacus aurantiacus* ssp. *Aurantiacus*
Sticky Monkeyflower
Δ Cliffs, canyon slopes, borders of chaparral
- P12** *Mimulus cardinalis*
Cardinal Monkeyflower
Δ Moist to wet places near streams
- P13** *Monardella* sp.
Coyote Mint
Δ Rocky slopes, ephemeral drainages, oak woodland, chaparral, montane forest

P14 *Camissonia californica*
California Evening Primrose
Δ Sandy / gravelly areas, dunes, desert scrub to pinon / juniper or ponderosa woodlands

P15 *Satureja douglasii*
Yerba Buena
Δ Shady places, chaparral, woodland

P16 *Sidalcea malviflora*
Checker Bloom, Checker Mallow
Δ Dry places in forest or scrub

P17 *Sisyrinchium bellum*
Blue-Eyed Grass
Δ Open, generally moist, grassy areas, woodlands

P18 *Iris* sp.
Fernald's Iris
Δ Shady places

P19 *Dudleya* sp.
Dudleya
Δ Rocky outcrops, slopes

P20 *Asarum caudatum*
Wild Ginger
Δ Moist places in forests

P21 *Lilium pardalinum* ssp.
Tiger Lily
Δ Moist places, streambanks, along coast

P22 *Eriophyllum staechadifolium*
Seaside Woolly Sunflower/Lizard Tail
Δ Coastal Strand, Coastal Sage Scrub

P23 *Perideridia kelloggii*
Yampah
Δ Open grassland, serpentine outcrops

P24 *Delphinium cardinale*
Scarlet Larkspur
Δ Slopes (often talus) in chaparral

P27 *Wyethia angustifolia*
Narrow leaf Mule ears
Δ Grassland

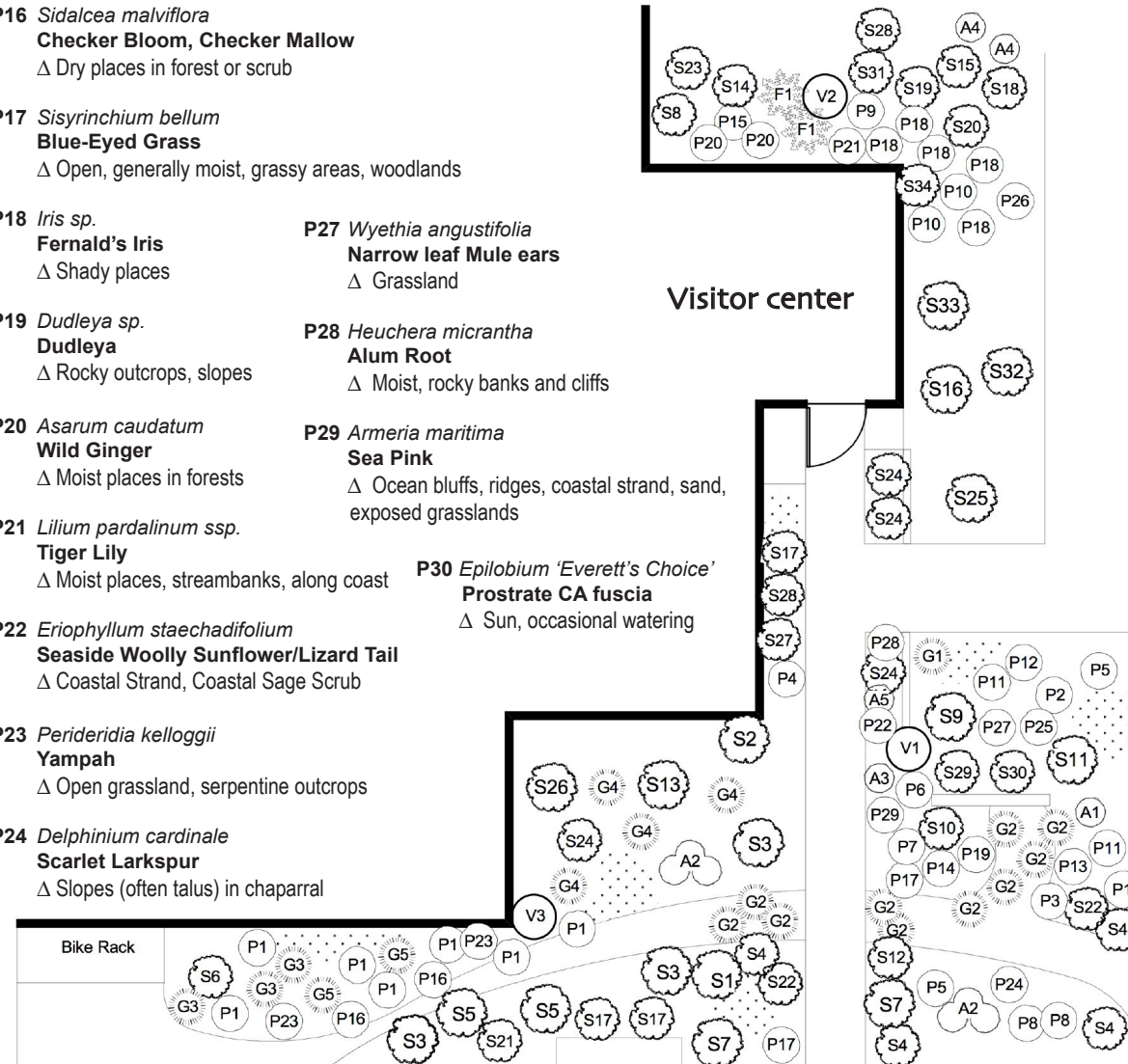
P28 *Heuchera micrantha*
Alum Root
Δ Moist, rocky banks and cliffs

P29 *Armeria maritima*
Sea Pink
Δ Ocean bluffs, ridges, coastal strand, sand, exposed grasslands

P30 *Epilobium 'Everett's Choice'*
Prostrate CA fuchsia
Δ Sun, occasional watering

P25 *Eriogonam elongatum*
Long stemmed Buckwheat
Δ Dry places

P26 *Helenium puberulum*
Rosilla, Sneezeweed
Streamsides, marshes, other wetlands

△ Streambanks, open places in forest

△ Slopes, canyons, coniferous forest, oak woodland, chaparral

California Flannelbush
△ Chaparral, oak/pine woodland, rocky ridges
- S27** *Mimulus aurantiacus*
sticky monkeyflower
△ Rocky hillsides, cliffs, canyon slopes, borders of chaparral
- S28** *Ribes sanguineum* 'Barrie Coate'

△ Many habitats
- S29** *Salvia munzii*
Munz's sage
△ Coastal-sage scrub, lower chaparral
- S30** *Ceanothus maritimus* 'Frosty Dawn'
Maritime ceanothus
△ Coastal hills, bluffs
- S31** *Symphoricarpos albus*
Snowberry
△ Shady woods, streambanks, north slopes
- S32** *Rhamnus crocea ssp. 'illicifolia'*
Hollyleaf coffeeberry
△ Coastal-sage scrub, chaparral, woodlands

△ Dry, shrubby slopes, canyons, ravines, streambanks, chaparral, foothill woodlands to yellow-pine forest

△ Streamsides, forest, chaparral

- A1** *Eriophyllum ambiguum*
Annual Woolly Sunflower
△ Woodland, desert
- A2** *Eschscholzia californica*
California Poppy
△ Grassy, open areas
- A3** *Stylomecon heterophylla*
Wind Poppy
△ Grassy areas, openings in chaparral
- A4** *Juncus bufonius*
Toad Rush
△ Moist (sometimes saline) open/disturbed places
- A5** *Clarkia rubicunda*
Farewell to Spring
△ Openings, woodland, forest, chaparral near coast

FERNS

- F1** *Athyrium (sp)*
Lady Fern
△ Moist or wet rock crevices, talus, cliffs, boulder bases, streamsides

GRASSES

- G1** *Calamagrostis nutkaensis*
Pacific Reed Grass
△ Wet areas, beaches, dunes, coastal woodland
- G2** *Deschampsia cespitosa ssp. holciformis* (Jughandle Creek Dwarf)
Coastal Tufted Hair-grass
△ Coastal marshes and meadows
- G3** *Bromus carinatus*
California Broome
△ Open scrub, woodland, forest
- G4** *Festuca rubra*
Red Fescue
△ Sand dunes, grassland, subalpine forest
- G5** *Nassella pulchra*
Purple Needlegrass
△ Oak woodland, chaparral, grassland
